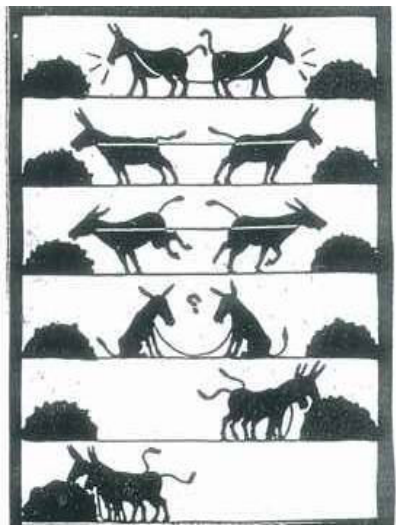
Dear Parents,

I am keen to share with you all, several reflections of a new School Principal after one week in the job:

- Last week's Staff Development Day (SDD) commenced with Mass celebrated by Fr Stephen ... I was captivated by Fr Stephen's intense fixation on the Eucharist at the high point of the Consecration (ie when he elevated the Host). Fr Stephen's fervent acknowledgement of the "Real Presence" is a singular gift to Prouille, and indeed to the wider Parish community.
- At the SDD I was privileged to work with a dedicated and enthusiastic staff in a true spirit of co-operation; I am confident that a myriad of goals can be achieved in 2009.
- On the first day for students I was particularly impressed with the effective leadership of all Yr 6 students; every Kindergarten child moved into class for the first time, seemingly without emotional distress thanks to the Yr 6 buddies.
- After visiting each class on Wednesday, I was similarly impressed with the settled and respectful atmosphere in every room. This same respect was evident in the first "after lunch" assembly on Wednesday.
- Finally, I have personally witnessed the remarkable "energy" of our Parents and Friends' body in the way that I have been made to feel welcome. Importantly, too, many new parents to Prouille this year have commented on how warmly they have been embraced and "included".

In 2008 Prouille School participated in a Whole School Review conducted by the Catholic Schools Office (CSO). This review provided several critical recommendations for future direction, and it's my job to ensure the recommendations are achieved in partnership with staff, parents, students and the wider community. In light of my reflections after one week, I am left feeling confident that Prouille is indeed "Born for Greater Things!"

Opening School Mass – Date change: (new date 11.2.09 – 9:15 am)

The previously advertised date for our Opening School Mass (12.2.09) had to be changed to Wednesday 11.2.09 - 9:15 am. I look forward to celebrating the Eucharist with Fr Stephen, staff, students, parents and friends next Wednesday.

2009 School Calendar:

A detailed 2009 school calendar accompanies this newsletter. This calendar will be updated each term with additions and amendments were necessary.

Friday Morning Assemblies – 8:55 am

Traditionally, Friday morning 8:55 am is a whole school assembly at Prouille; this will continue in 2009. Our community will gather to pray, celebrate birthdays, distribute awards and hear important school messages. Parents and friends are, of course, welcome to attend.

Meet the Teacher Night (for parents) – 11.2.09 – 7:00 pm

All parents are strenuously urged to attend the “Meet the Teacher Night” next Wednesday 11.2.09 (7:00 pm). The evening will commence with a Whole School Meeting in the School Hall at 7:00 pm for 20 minutes, then each teacher will present two identical 20-25 minute sessions re 2009 class routines, curriculum issues etc (in their classrooms). I appreciate that there are several families with more than two children; I also appreciate that the sessions may be structured in such a way that you can't be in two places at the same time ... Because of this, teachers have prepared a handout to assist. Naturally, parents are able to meet teachers at any time in the year; a phone call to the school office is usually the best way to set up a meeting.

- 7:30-7:50 pm: Session # 1 – Yrs K, 1, 2
- 8:00-8:20pm: Session # 2 – Yrs 3, 4, 5, 6

NB Teachers will do a presentation at 7:30 pm and 8:00 pm, but their main group presentation is listed at the time above. We have clustered the class sessions “geographically” so parents with more than two children can easily visit two classes in one session time if they choose.

School Fees 2009

Coming home to parents today (separate to this newsletter) is a statement of fees for 2009. This year's statements contain important information re the method of payment parents have chosen; the statements clearly indicate dates when direct debits will be made etc. Parents with children in Yr 6 will notice that the first payment for 2009 includes the \$180 Yr 6 Challenge Ranch fee. Yr 6 parents need to be aware that an additional "Canberra Camp" fee will be billed separately in the year. It is hoped that in 2010 we will be able to include both camps in the general school fees to assist with managing payments and collection.

Please contact me (Philip Ledlin) immediately if you are experiencing difficulties re payments; I sincerely assure parents that matters re “financial difficulty” will be handled with understanding and extreme confidentiality.

I stress the importance of keeping up to date with payments for two reasons:

- To assist with budgeting at home in order to avoid insurmountable debts when Christmas approaches (I strenuously recommend periodic payment options)
- To ensure the school has a steady income stream throughout the year for managing the day to day running

PROUILLE SWIMMING CARNIVAL – THURSDAY, MARCH 5, AT HORNSBY POOL



Thank you to all the parents who have kindly offered to help at next week's carnival.

Volunteers will be notified of their jobs last week.

To ensure we have a happy and safe day, please take time to read the following important information.

- All children should have returned permission notes to their class teacher.
- Parents should have indicated on permission notes whether or not their child is going by car or bus to and from the pool.
- Roll Call will be taken at the beginning and end of the day at school and at the pool.
- Any parent who has made previous arrangements to take their child home early (i.e. written note) must see their child's class teacher or colour house teacher before they leave the pool.
- Girls should wear a one-piece costume and boys should wear racing costumes (eg speedos). No bikinis or board shorts will be allowed.
- Children should bring the following:
 - colour house swimming cap
 - goggles (optional)
 - hat and sunscreen
 - warm jacket
 - rain coat (just in case!!!)
 - safety pin for ribbons
- Children are welcome to wear house colours to add to the spirit of the day.
- Children are to remain in the grandstand with the colour house teachers. They are not allowed to go wandering.
- Children are not to go to the marshalling area until called.
- No towels are to be taken to the marshalling area.
- No child is allowed in the training pool.
- Children should bring adequate food and drink.
- Children are NOT allowed to go to the kiosk, however parents are allowed to buy them food or drinks.
- If a child misses a race, they must see the colour house teacher who can send them to the marshalling area. If possible we will find a spot in another race.
- Points will be allocated for 1st (4), 2nd (3), 3rd (2) and 4th (1).
- Ribbons will be given for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th in each race.
- Trophies will be given to the Girl and Boy Junior and Senior Champions.
- Medals will be given for the runners-up in the championships.
- Medals will also be presented to the winners of the 50 metre Invitation races.

Class Parents play an extremely important and rewarding role in the school. Just as important, the children love to have their parents involved in school life. Each class usually has a nominated teacher contact class parent plus an additional 2-3 class parents helpers, but the more the merrier!

Class Parent duties include the following;

Family & Community: Welcome new families and help them settle in to the Prouille way of life, help families in need (eg. Co-ordinate child pick-ups/drop offs, food hampers or just to take the time for a chat).

Parish: Assist with the Class Mass & organise the morning tea.
